2009 Honoree Judy Erwin

Executive Director of the Illinois Board of Higher Education

Judy Erwin has served as the Executive Director of the Illinois Board of Higher Education (IBHE), the State's coordinating board for postsecondary education, since 2005. She came to IBHE after serving in the Illinois House of Representatives for 10 years, representing a district that included Chicago's Loop, Near North, and Lincoln Park neighborhoods. In the House, Judy chaired the House Higher Education Committee and served as Vice-Chair of the Appropriations-Higher Education Committee. She was active in the Conference of Women Legislators and in the National Conference of State Legislatures.

As the Executive Director of IBHE, she manages a professional staff responsible for a \$2.7 billion higher education budget and academic program approvals for all postsecondary degree granting programs in the State of Illinois. Since her term at IBHE began in 2005, Judy has worked successfully with a broad group of constituencies to develop an "Illinois Public Agenda for College and Career Success," focused on four key goals to improve educational attainment for Illinois residents and strengthen the links between education and the economy. She has been instrumental in Illinois' creation of a P-20 Longitudinal Student Data System and the State's participation in the American Diploma Project to improve academic preparation for Illinois high school students. Prior to her term in the Illinois House of Representatives, Judy had the privilege of serving as the Communications Director for Senate President Philip J. Rock from 1979 to 1992.

Judy is a member of the Executive Committee of the State Higher Education Executive Officers Organization (SHEEO), a Commissioner on the Midwestern Higher Education Compact (MHEC), and a Board member of the Illinois Education Research Council. Judy has served on the Executive Committee of the Chicago Community Trust since 2003, appointed by Mayor Richard M. Daley. She is also a Board member of Planned Parenthood Illinois.

Judy holds a bachelor's degree from the University of Wisconsin-Whitewater, a master's degree from the former National College of Education (now National-Louis University), and is ABD (All But Dissertation) from the University of Illinois at Chicago in Public Policy Analysis and Political Science. She also attended the Kennedy School of Government's Senior Executives in State and Local Government program at Harvard University.
